## Grade Point Average

 (GPA):- $\mathrm{A}=4.0 \quad 90-100$
- $B=3.0$
- $C=2.0$

80-89
C $=2.0$
74-79

- $D=1.0$

70-73

- $F=0.0$

69 and $\downarrow$

## HOW DO I CALCULATE A GPA?

- Step 1: Assign each grade a numeric value

| $A=4$ | $(90-100 \%)$ |
| :--- | :--- |
| $B=3$ | $(80-89 \%)$ |
| $C=2$ | $(74-79 \%)$ |
| $D=1$ | $(70-73 \%)$ |
| $F=0$ | $(0-69 \%)$ |

- $B=3 \quad$ (80-89\%)
- C=2 (74-79\%)
$D=1$ (70-73\%)
$F=0 \quad(0-69 \%)$

AP and Honors courses earn quality points
$\mathrm{AP}=+1$ quality point
Honors $=+0.5$ quality point

- Step 2: Add all the numeric values together
* Step 3: Divide by the total number of credits (classes) attempted


## GPA EXAMPLES

## Example 1

Algebral-B $=3.0$
World Geography - A=4.0
Intro to Drafting - B $=3.0$
Art $-B=3.0$
$3.0+4.0+3.0+3.0=13$
$13 / 4=3.25$ GPA

Example 2
H Algebra $-\mathrm{C}=2.5$
H World Geography - B = 3.5
Intro to Drafting - B $=3.0$
Art $-\mathrm{A}=4.0$
$2.5+3.5+3.0+4.0=13$
$13 / 4=3.25$ GPA

- Provides opportunities to improve study skills
* Familiarizes you with college level work
* Can boost your cumulative, weighted GPA
* Prepares you for big tests (ACT, SAT, EOCs)
- Gives you an advantage in college admissions
* Allows you to expand your interests
- May be eligible for college credit (AP Exam)
- Improves critical thinking skills for workforce
- BUT... you must find the right balance for YOU; don't compare yourself to others

## HOW MANY CREDITS DO I NEED TO GRADUATE?

| Area of Study | Required Credits |
| :---: | :---: |
| English/Language Arts | 4 credits (9th Lit, American Lit) |
| Mathematics | 4 credits (Alg I, Geom, Adv Alg) |
| Science | 4 credits (Bio, Physics/Physical Science, Chem/Earth/ Env Sci) |
| Social Studies | 3 credits (World, US, Gov/Econ) |
| World Language/Technical/Fine Art | 3 credits |
| Personal Fitness | 0.5 credit |
| Health | 0.5 credit |
| Electives | 4 credits |
| TOTAL CREDITS: | 23 |

## Grade Level Required Credits

$10^{\text {th }} \quad 5$ credits
(1 credit each in core English, Math and Science)
$11^{\text {th }} \quad 10$ credits
(2 credits each in core English, Math, and Science)
$12^{\text {th }} \quad 16$ credits
(on track for graduation)

## DUAL ENROLLMENT (DE)

> DE is a state funded program that allows $11^{\text {th }}$ and $12^{\text {th }}$ graders to take college classes while completing their high school diploma.


DE pays for 100\% tuition, mandatory fees, and required textbooks up to a maximum cap of 30 hours
