**Requirements:** Senior in high school (MUST be 17 or older by start date), application, official high school transcript and recommendations

**Dates:** June 5<sup>th</sup>-July 12<sup>th</sup> – mandatory orientation on June 4<sup>th</sup>

**Application deadline:** application open now

**Cost:** must pay for own transportation, meals and your accommodations

### Center for Disease Control (CDC) Summer Camp

The *CDC Disease Detective Camp* teaches attendees the fundamentals of CDC's work: the field of public health and the science of epidemiology. Public health is a vast field that covers many aspects of keeping populations of people healthy. It includes, but is not limited to, research, data collection, data analysis, and health education. Epidemiology, the systematic study of diseases in populations, is one of the sciences used at CDC to help improve the public's health.

**Requirements:** Application, essay, recommendation, proof of birth date, must be a rising junior or senior and must turn 16 by the first day of camp

**Dates:** One session will be offered June 17-21, July 8-12 and July 22-26 of 2019. All days are 8:45 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.

**Deadline:** March 29, 2019

**Cost:** no cost for the program, only for transportation to and from campus and lunch each day
